A Weapon So Powerful!

James 3:7-10 (NLT)

7 People can tame all kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and fish, 8 but no one can tame the tongue. It is restless and evil, full of deadly poison. 9 Sometimes it praises our Lord and Father, and sometimes it curses those who have been made in the image of God. 10 And so blessing and cursing come pouring out of the same mouth. Surely, my brothers and sisters, this is not right!

Recently I enjoyed time away on annual leave with my family, where we attended a circus in Hervey Bay, Queensland. As the lions came out you could hear the crowd in awe and amazement of the marvelous, majestic and mighty creatures. In a matter of seconds, these animals could destroy the lion tamer and yet, they did as he requested: jumping, sitting, roaring and rolling without hesitation or rebellion.

James notes that even these magnificent animals can be tamed, but not the human tongue, while Proverbs (18:21) teaches us that the power of life and death is in the tongue. Words are a powerful thing. They give us the power to heal and the power to hurt. The power to give hope and the power to discourage. The power to build up and the power to tear down. There is no marriage, family, friendship or church that isn't either made stronger or made weaker by how you choose and use your words.

It is interesting to consider that one of the first things that a physician does when examining a patient is look at his or her tongue, since it so often gives an indication to the health of the rest of the body. In the same way, that which is produced by the tongue - words - also act as an indication to the health of the spiritual body - the heart.

As leaders we are to speak a certain language:

1. A language that is full of life and not death

- 2. A language that is understandable to those listening to us
- 3. A language filled with wisdom and truth
- 4. A language that attracts and does not repel
- 5. A language which builds faith
- 6. A language which is quick to ask for forgiveness
- 7. A language that is filled with praise for the King of Kings

A distinguishing characteristic of a leader is that they speak words that others can and want to follow. Those around us love to be in our presence because we are speaking life, faith and truth into them and the situations around us.

Let us never take for granted or think that we have our tongues 'under control,' as even the Bible declares that it is impossible. Therefore, we must remain diligent to ensure we are, to the best of our abilities using this powerful weapon to bring life!

To see tears run down their face, as little toddlers cling to their legs calling out 'Mumma', because they don't want to miss being picked up and cuddled by the team. It is so heart-warming to watch the team give of their time, often for the first time in their life, to a special needs teenager that is so excited to have a new friend give them attention. It is often the simplest things being done that make the biggest difference.
